Report of NSS Committee 2016-2017

Asmita college of Arts and commerce Vikhroli has been in the forefront of NSS activities. The college NSS unit has a strength of 150 volunteers. It has undertaken many social and environmental programs which are very helpful to all.

Enrollment campaign and general orientation program was conducted for the first-year degree students. An awareness rally and a tree plantation program were conducted. Under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan different programs like awareness rally street play exhibition and lectures were conducted in the college, adopted area and other college surrounding areas. We organized cleanliness drive and plastic free campaign in the campus. Paper bags were prepared by the volunteers and distributed in the nearby shops.

Awareness on save electricity, water and pollution free festivals were done in the college. A lecture on cancer awareness was done by Ms. Jaya Krishnan.
