NSS Committee Report (2018-2019)

Asmita college Vikhroli has an effervescent NSS unit with an objective of providing a dais to the interested students to take part in social and cultural activities during their college life. Enrollment drive was conducted in the month of July and 150 volunteers enrolled for the year 2018-2019. An orientation program for the new comers was also organized. The NSS unit of our college celebrated yoga day on 21st June 2018. A lecture on cancer awareness was delivered by Ms. Jaya Krishnan from Vasantha Memorial Cancer Centre Vikhroli (E). NSS Volunteers and staff members attended the lecture.

Swachh Bharat pledge was administered at the college by students and staff. Posters were made by the volunteers. Street play on Swachh Bharat was performed by NSS volunteers at the college campus market area, Kannamwar Nagar 1,2 and Vikhroli areas. Different awareness programs were conducted at different places. Three volunteers of our college attended the RRC workshop conducted by MDACS in which they were informed about HIV and AIDS. Awareness programs through posters street play, lectures were done by the volunteers in the college and adopted area. Quiz Competition, essay competitions, and Group Discussion on HIV/AIDS were conducted for the volunteers. Asmita college NSS unit organized a voting awareness program to aware the students about the importance of registration for voters ID. 102 students of Asmita college registered their names in the voter' list. New voter' machine VVPAT demo was conducted in the college by officers from Election Office. NSS Asmita team conducted awareness program and Thalasseamia test Total 116 students got their blood checked for Thalasseamia. Along with this we have conducted Blood donation camp in association with JJ Mahanagar Blood Bank. Total 25 blood units were collected.

On account of road safety week volunteers prepared posters and exhibited them on the college premises. A workshop was arranged by NGO United Ways. Disaster Management Workshop for NSS volunteers was arranged in the college. Too aware about 'ave Water and energy 'SS volunteers made class to class awareness. A lecture on "ender sensitisation was delivered by Prof. Vijaya Krishnan NSS volunteers made posters on "eti Bachao Beti Padao"topic and an exhibition of posters were made in the college. A tree plantation program was conducted in the college premises and nearby ground. 25 saplings were planted. During Ganpati festival NSS Volunteers made a lead role to control the people and maintain discipline. NSS Asmita unit had setup desks at college for the collection of sugar, dal and other food items to donate to Premdan " home for sick and dying destitute" We got a positive response from students. After collection of these, volunteers visited Premdan and handover it to their office. NSS volunteers made paper bags and cotton bags, distributed in the areas of Vikhroli.
